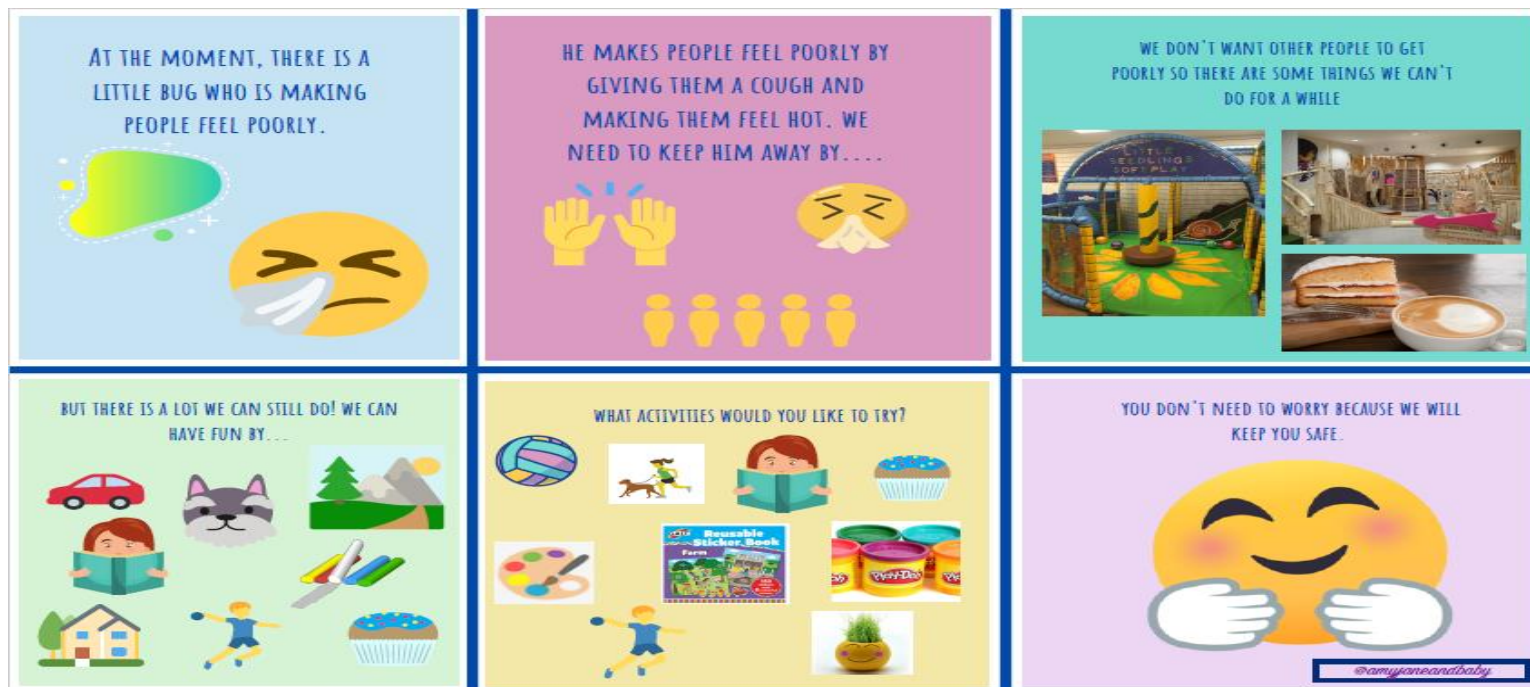


## Spring Term Week 11 (and until further notice)
