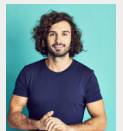

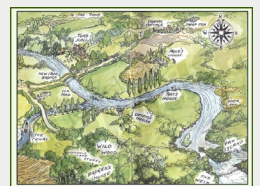

The Wind in the Willows by Kenneth Grahame

This is a classic story and features four main characters, Mole, Ratty, Badger and Toad. The author brings the animals to life as characters in his book. This is an illustration from one of the first published copies of "Wind in the Willows"!



Mole is often frightened of things, but he finds enough courage to face his fears in the Wild Wood. Rat is strong and self-assured, a perfect friend for a young, shy Mole. Badger is the grown-up amongst the four friends, though he is moody and likes to be by himself. However, he helps avoid danger in the Wild Wood. Toad is a comedian and is often boastful, but he is good company.
