Ready

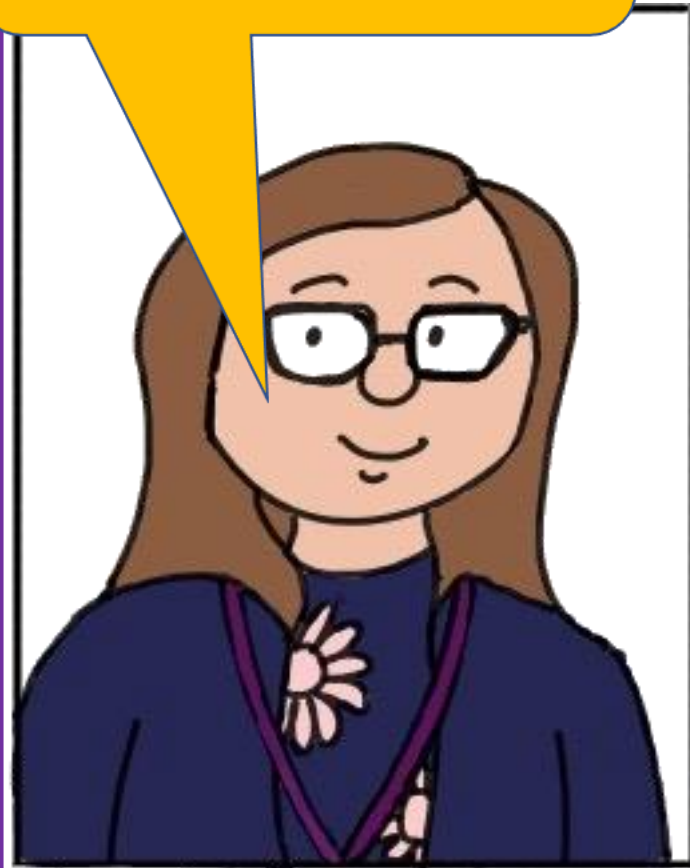
Respectful

We're using the computers soon. We'd better tidy away our books so that we're ready to start.



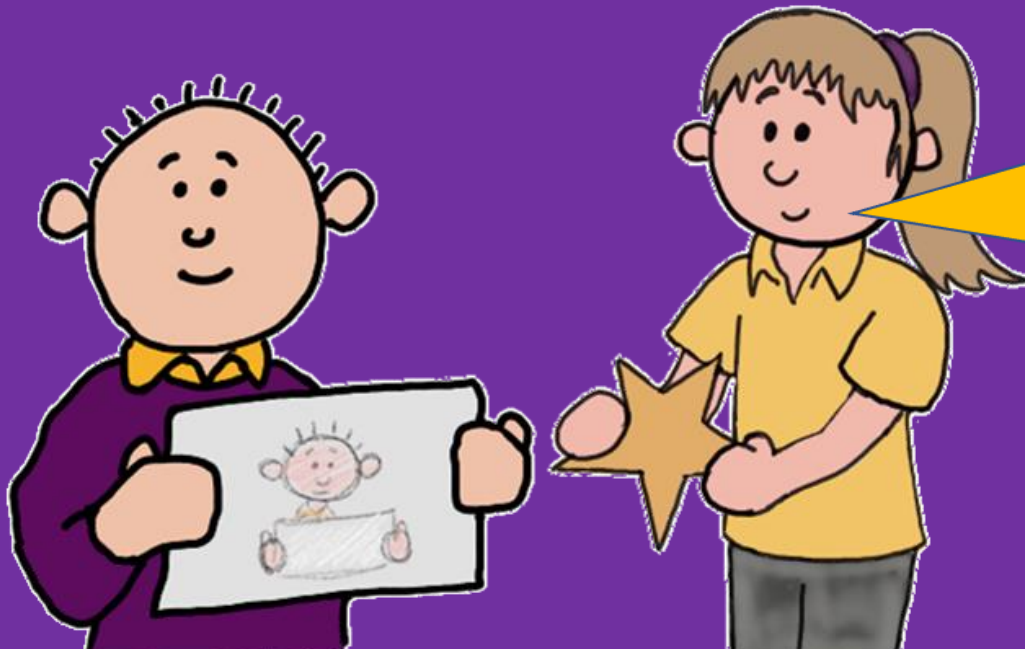
What does it mean to be respectful?

Great game! You played really well today and you're learning fast!



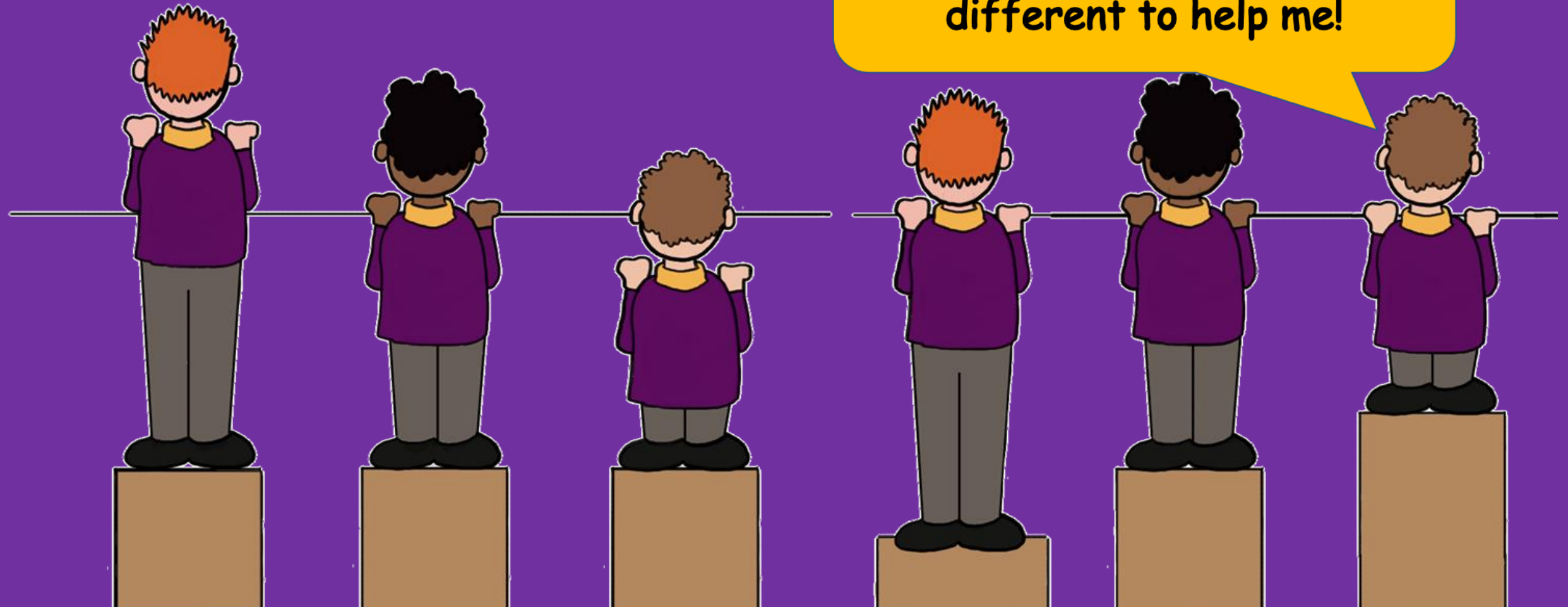
Wow! I know how hard you worked to complete this picture! I think it's great!
