Before entering the school building, Reception staff have checks that they need to carry out. Each visitor is given an information leaflet.

People who work at our school have had the special checks done and they wear these lanyards around their neck which also has their photographs on them.



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How else do we keep you safe in school?

Visitors

All visitors go to the main office and Mrs Mackey, Mrs Smith or Mrs Hynds will carry out any checks and give them a lanyard like the ones below.



An adult wearing this lanyard can walk around the school without a staff member.



An adult wearing this lanyard must always have someone from our school staff with them.

Visitors

There is another type of visitor that we may have in school. These visitors are called Governors and they help Mrs Cross. They wear black lanyards that look like this.

Although all of the Governors keep us safe, like the DSLs, there is a special Governor called Mr Paul Owens.



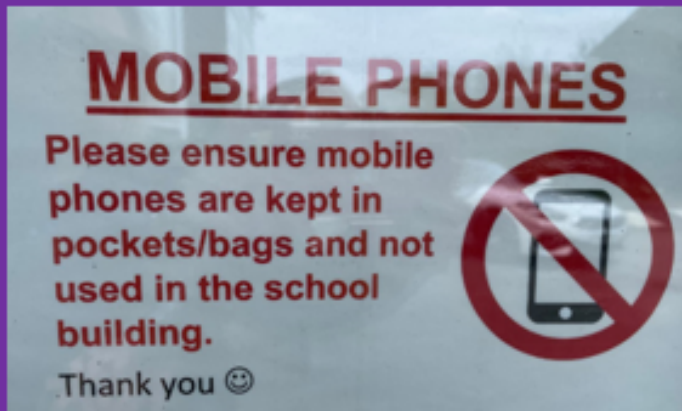

IMPORTANT

All adults must wear a sticker or lanyard. Also adults should not be using their mobile phones within school unless DSLs need to use it for an emergency.



If you see a visitor in school without a sticker or lanyard or on their phone, please tell an adult in your year group straight away!

<h3>Stay safe from strangers</h3> <p>Online friends are not always who they say they are. Think carefully about what you tell and show to your online friends.</p> 	<h3>Be respectful and kind</h3> <p>Use kind words and actions online and in real life.</p> 
<h3>Keep details private</h3> <p>Keep passwords, login details, photos and videos private so that you stay in control of them.</p> 	<h3>Tell a trusted adult</h3> <p>If something you see online makes you feel uncomfortable or unhappy, remember that you can always tell a trusted adult, either at home or in school.</p>

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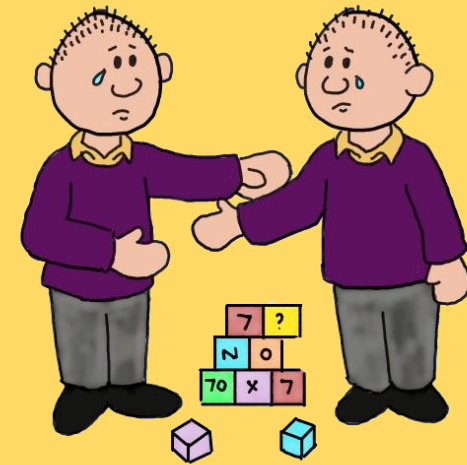


Using technology safely and keeping safe.

DO NOT AGREE TO THIS.





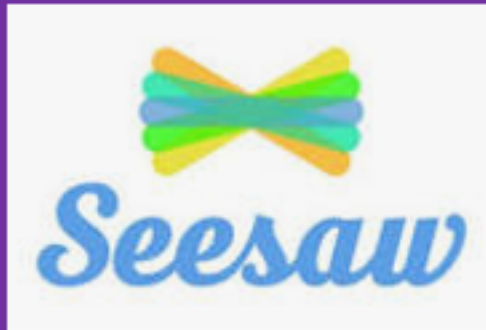

You can then send this to the teachers on Seesaw or get a grown up to email it.

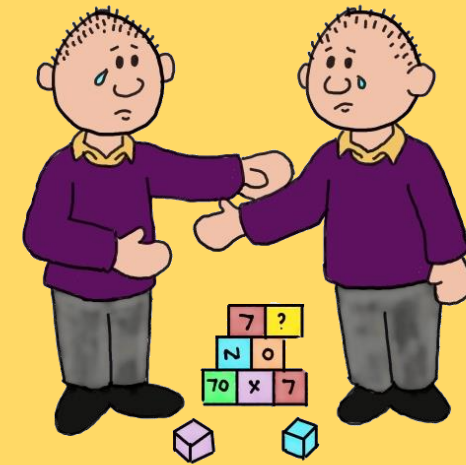
If it is a message from a group leave that group or block the person.

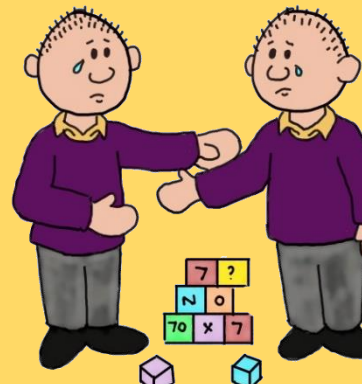

This can also be your swimsuit area.

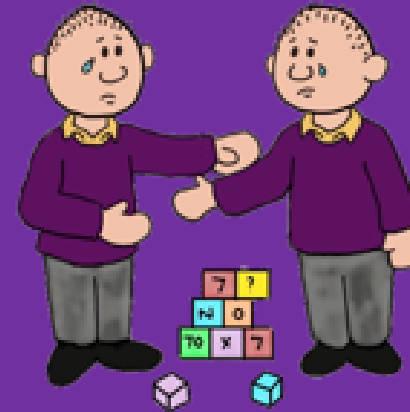

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What is bullying?



Bullying (including Cyberbullying) Bullying is defined as

“behaviour by an individual or group, usually repeated over time, which intentionally hurts another individual or group either physically or emotionally”.



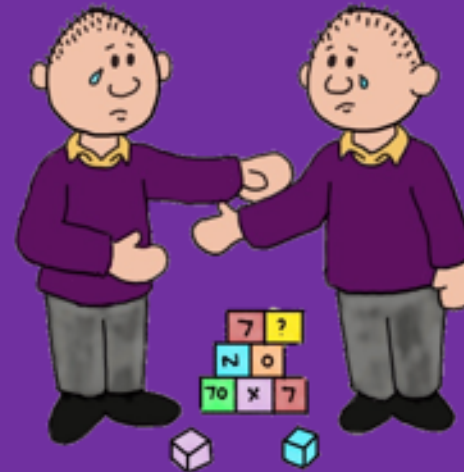

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What is bullying?

Bullying often starts with little events and it is behaviour that hurts someone else – such as

- name calling,
- hitting, pushing,
- spreading hurtful and untruthful rumours,
- threatening or undermining someone;
- mocking;
- making offensive comments;
- taking belongings;
- inappropriate touching;
- producing offensive graffiti;
- or always leaving someone out of groups.



It can happen anywhere – at school, at home or online. It's usually repeated over a long period of time and can hurt a child both physically and emotionally.

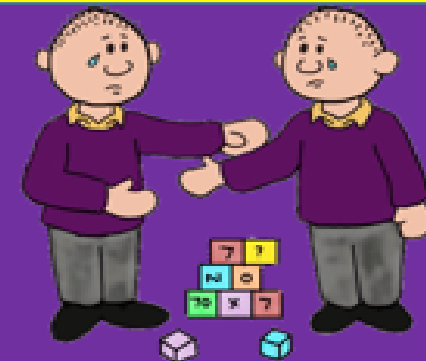


Bullying can also be known as **Child on Child** Abuse (this used to be called Peer on Peer but lots of children found this difficult to remember)

Child means children in your class, year group or you come into contact with inside or out of school.

Any of these behaviours must be reported to an adult and **we will take this seriously and help and support you.**

Sometimes you might think it is too embarrassing to say but you **MUST speak up.**

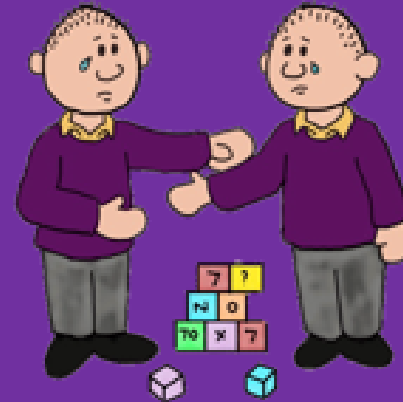

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Types of Bullying



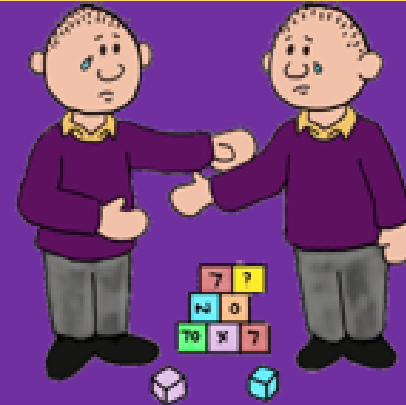
'Cyberbullying':
involves sending inappropriate or hurtful text messages, emails or instant messages, posting malicious material online (e.g. on social networking websites) or sending or posting offensive or degrading images and videos.



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Types of Bullying



Racist and Religious Bullying:

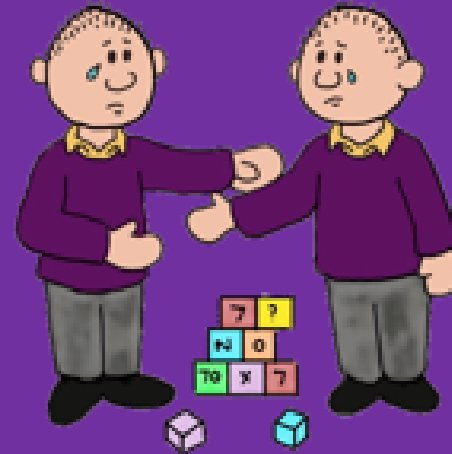
A range of hurtful behaviour, both physical and psychological, that makes a person feel unwelcome, marginalised, excluded, powerless or worthless because of their colour, ethnicity, culture, faith community, national origin or national status.



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Types of Bullying



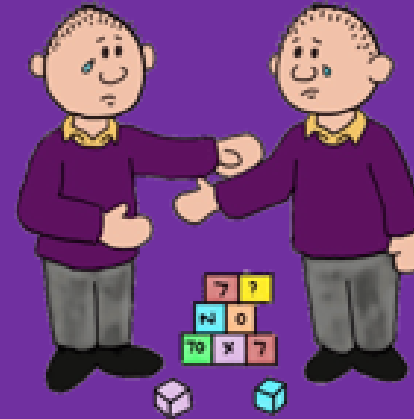
Sexual, Sexist and Transphobic Bullying:
includes any behaviour, whether physical or non-physical, where
sexuality is used as a weapon by boys or girls.



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Types of Bullying



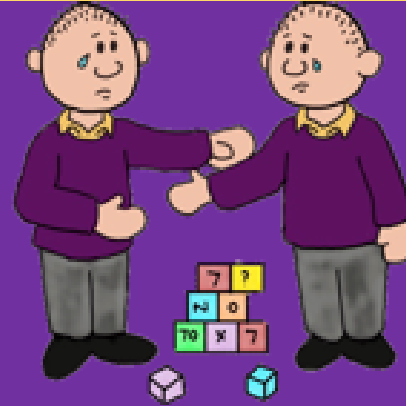
Homophobic Bullying:
targets someone because of their sexual orientation (or
perceived sexual orientation).

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Types of Bullying



Disablist Bullying:

targets a young person solely based on their disability, this can include manipulative bullying where a perpetrator forces the victim to act in a certain way, or exploiting a certain aspect of the victims disability.
